Quebec announces an investment of \$4.5 million in mental health research initiatives

On November 28, Quebec announced an investment of **\$4.5 million** in mental health research initiatives. These include 4 research projects and the Alliance en santé mentale et neurosciences, which will bring together Quebec's three university mental health institutes, including the Douglas Research Centre (CIUSSS Ouest-de-l'Île-de-Montréal), CERVO (CIUSSS Capitale-Nationale), and the Centre de recherche de l'Institut universitaire

Dr. Kyle Greenway, Assistant Professor

Psychiatry in July 2023 as a full-time Assistant
Professor (Clinical).

Dr. Greenway completed his Psychiatric Residency and the Clinical Investigator program at McGill University, as well as a fellowship at Imperial College's Psychedelic Research Centre. He has a longstanding interest in research, evolving from chemistry and physics during a Master's degree at Simon Fraser University to clinical and mechanistic studies of novel psychiatric treatments, particularly ketamine and serotonergic psychedelic agents in conjunction with psychotherapy.

Dr. Greenway is honored to be returning to his alma mater and thrilled to join the Jewish General Hospital, where his clinical practice will focus on consult-liaison psychiatry and novel treatments of refractory mood disorders.
