Minor Concentration in Psychology (for non-Psychology majors only*)

IMPORTANT NOTE: This 18-credit minor concentration is for Arts students who are not doing a Psych major. Science students wishing to do a Psych minor must complete a 24-credit Minor.

18 credits

Prerequisite requirement:

All students intending to register for the minor concentration in Psychology should have previously completed a course in *Introductory Psychology* at either the CEGEP/college or university level.

- Acceptable CEGEP courses are as follows: 350-101 or 350-201 or 350-102 or 350-202
 - More specific CEGEP level psychology courses, such as developmental or abnormal 0 psychology, are not acceptable.
- Students who:
 - have completed the Psychology option of the International Baccalaureate, or 0
 - who have Advanced Placement credit in Psychology, or 0
 - have completed a course in **Introductory Psychology at another college or university** are all considered to have fulfilled the requirement.
- Students who have *not* completed any such course must register for PSYC 100: Introduction to Psychology upon declaration of their minor concentration. They may take this course concurrently with PSYC 204, PSYC 305, PSYC 211, PSYC 212, PSYC 213, or PSYC 215. All other psychology courses require previous completion of **PSYC** 100 prior to registration.

Minor Concentration Requirements (18 credits) **

• Any two of the following courses (6 credits total):

PSYC 204: Introductory Statistics***

- PSYC 211: Introduction to Behavioural Neuroscience
- PSYC 212 : Perception PSYC 213 : Cognition
- **PSYC** 215 : Social Psychology
- 12 credits in Psychology at the 300, 400 or 500 level level:

*Arts students completing the 36-credit Major Concentration in Psychology can complete a minor in Behavioral Science instead.

**Students doing a Psychology minor who decide to switch and do a major or major concentration should be sure to check the requirements for these programs, as the prerequisites may differ.

^{***}Management students may not take PSYC 204. And students who have completed the equivalent course(s) in CEGEP as indicated in the Undergraduate Calendar may not take PSYC 204.
