

PSYC 349D1/D2: Psychology Research Experience

This application form is to be submitted by e-mail to undergrad.psych@mcgill.ca

This course is intended to provide students with hands-on experience conducting research in the laboratory of a faculty member in psychology or a related discipline (e.g., education, psychiatry). The exact nature of the experience will differ by laboratory, but students will be involved in some combination of the following: literature searches; experimental design; experiment programming; data collection (running participants or animals through experiments); data entry; data coding; data analysis.

Students are expected to devote approximately 5 hours/week to the course over two semesters, although the exact distribution of workload will be determined between the faculty member and the student.

Students will be evaluated on: 1) their participation in the lab and their completion of assigned tasks (60%); 2) an oral presentation given in the context of a lab meeting or relative activity (the faculty member must be present; 20%); 3) a reflection paper that describes tasks completed over the year and what was learned as well as areas of strength, weakness, and future development for the student (20%).

NOTE: This course can only be taken once. This course cannot be taken at the same time as a full-year research project course (i.e., PSYC 380, PSYC 450, PSYC 484, PSYC 488).
