The mission of the Peter-McGill Community Council is to bring together and promote collaboration between the district's residents, businesses, workers and students, as well as the organizations that serve them. This will allow the student to get a big picture of the issues and related initiatives in Peter-McGill, to help create a coherent comprehension of our community dynamics, and to identify some of the gaps/needs that are not being met by existing services.

- GPA of 2.7 or higher.
- An updated resume.
- A letter of motivation.
- Willingness to participate in workshops and training provided by the Arts Internship Office and adhere to the regulations outlined in the Faculty of Arts Internship Handbook.
- Priority given to students enrolled in the Minor in Quebec Studies **or students that have the intention to possibly enrolled** in the Minor in Quebec Studies (18 credits) in the fall of 2024.
