Mark Wrathall is Professor of Philosophy at the University of Oxford and a Tutorial Fellow at Corpus Christi College. He specializes in 19th and 20th century European philosophy, with a particular focus on the existential and phenomenological traditions of thought. Current areas of research involve the philosophy of agency, phenomenology of religion, and philosophy of art. He is a internationally renowned scholar on the work Martin Heidegger.
