

Mark Wrathall is Professor of Philosophy at the University of Oxford and a Tutorial Fellow at Corpus Christi College. He specializes in 19th and 20th century European philosophy, with a particular focus on the existential and phenomenological traditions of thought. Current areas of research involve the philosophy of agency, phenomenology of religion, and philosophy of art. He is an internationally renowned scholar on the work of Martin Heidegger. His publications include: *The Cambridge Heidegger Lexicon* (2019); *The Cambridge Companion to Heidegger's Being and Time* (2013); *Heidegger and Unconcealment: Truth, Language and History* (2011); *How to Read Heidegger* (2006); and *Religion after Metaphysics* (2003)
