Freshman Program – General Facts

- For students arriving from outside the province of Quebec
- Established in 2008, with 50 students; presently enrolled at 193 students
- Demographics: 1/3 Canadian, 1/3 American, 1/3 international
- Provides tools necessary for transition/adjustment to first year university by using a holistic, personalized, student-centered approach



Freshman Program – Structure

- Student programming offered by a variety of university services
- Program components:
 - Freshman Seminar
 - advising
 - academic support



- Purpose: to integrate support and engagement mechanisms in the curriculum.
- Pass/Fail courses: 0.5 credit/term, 1.5 hours/week
- Consists of mandatory and optional activities.
- Students need to submit a short summary paragraph after each completed activity.



- Fall semester mandatory activities:

 - Student success series
 - Procrastination / time management counsellor
 - OSD services
 - Frugal scholar
 - Health services campus nurse



- Fall semester mandatory activities:

 - Engagement and philanthropy
 - Emerging leaders



- Winter semester mandatory activities:
 - CaPS and internship office
 - Rez Project race and colonialism
 - Degree/Major presentations
 - Majors' Fair



- Fall/Winter optional activities:
 - Ecomuseum visit
 - Cooking workshop
 - Internship poster presentations
 - NSERC/USRA poster competition
 - Language café
 - Snowshoeing trip



Freshman Program – Advising

- Prospective students: meetings throughout the year
- Registered students
 - pre-emptive advising for students with advanced standing
 - advising sessions during Orientation week
 - drop-in advising during the term Doodle poll sign up
 - mandatory advising during midterm assessment
 - emergency/crisis management
