4. Geography

New Course:

GEOG 418 Geographies of Race

3 credits

Prof. Forest introduced a new GEOG 418 course in the Department of Geography. The course was proposed in response to a significant demand by students and will be taught by a new professor hired as part of McGill's Plan to Address Anti-Black Racism.

Prof. Forest **moved**, seconded by Prof. Dufour that the course be adopted.

Course Revision:

GEOG 417 Urban Geography AC-22-122

3 credits

Change in prerequisite

Prof. Forest said that when the Department first proposed GEOG 417, the prerequisite course GEOG 316 was mistakenly omitted from the list of prerequisites.

Prof. Forest **moved**, seconded by Prof. Dufour, that the changes be approved.

5. Pharmacology & Therapeutics

B.Sc. Program Changes:

- Honours in Pharmacology
- Major in Pharmacology
- Major was AC-22-124

Prof. Hales said two Complementary courses (PHAR 522 D1/D2 and PHAR 524) that were recently approved were being added to the Honours and Major Programs in Pharmacology. These courses will be suitable for future medical professionals or translational researchers.

Among some housekeeping changes in the above Psychology programs, the main revisions concerned the proposed recommended background requirements and whether requiring 200-level courses as an entry requirement was permitted in programs. After a lengthy discussion, Associate Dean Hundemer said these programs had precedence and were not considered new changes. There are similar requirements in some Mathematics and Statistics programs. However, he emphasized that the Academic Committee will consider each program change on a case-by-case basis.

Prof. Bartz **moved**, seconded by Prof. Forest, that the above changes be approved.

7. Barbados Field Study Semester (BFSS)

Prof. Virginie Millien, the new Program Director of the Barbados Field Study Semester (BFSS), introduced the revisions to the BFSS. She said the program had been offered at the Bellairs Research Institute since 2003 under the Faculty of Agricultural and Environmental Sciences. Following a Cyclical Review and retirement of the program director, the BFSS will be administered by the Faculty of Science, focusing on the study of sustainability science, emphasizing the Caribbean.

The BFSS consists of a total of 15 credits, which include four new three-credit courses (below) open to U2 and U3 students registered in the BFSS from all faculties.

Prof. Neslehova explained that students cannot take both MATH 317 (Numerical Analysis) and COMP 350 (Numerical Computing) for credits. A statement in the program description, under the list of Required courses, would now prevent students from taking both courses.

9. Computer Science

New Course (approved as COMP 692*) COMP 689 Internship Course
