III. Budget

Dean Lennox reported on the budget concerns presented by the University in March 2020 due to

the pandemic. The University's concern was the potential of insufficient student enrolments as this is linked directly to the University's revenue. Dean Lennox reported that this did not in fact happen and that the budget is back on track based on what it can accommodate in professor hiring.

Dean Lennox announced that it is Professor Manfredi's first day in the new role as Principal and that the new co-partnership Provost roles were in effect with Professor Labeau and Professor Campbell in place.

7) SCIENCE UNDERGRADUATE SOCIETY (SUS) REPORT

Ms. Zhang reported that the Science Undergraduate Society is excited to welcome back students to the first fully in-person semester since 2019. The first Executive Council meeting was held on August 31st, and the first General council meeting will be held on September 21st, both in person. The SUS Departmental Orientation Day is held on September 17th and includes event equity training, environmental sustainability, and a presentation from OSVRSE. The committee, alongside the Arts Undergraduate Society (AUS) is also organizing the Grad Fair in early November.

The SUS committee is also looking forward to an apartment crawl in the evening for a nice social aspect of orientation to end the day.

The Vice-President External is working to plan the student bar, After Hours, which be held at Gerts Bar bi-weekly. The committee is hoping to have more themed events and special science themed drinks as a social outlet for the students.

The Vice-President Sustainability is working on a personal project, which is an equity- based research grant. The committee is working with Associate Dean Nilson to discuss potential funding sources.

Ms. Zhang reported that First Year Orientation, or Frosh, was successfully conducted at the end of August in a fully in-person format and included many old traditions such as Boat Cruise and Beach Day. Over 700 science first-years took part in the events over the 5 days. The VP Internal and his Science Internal Committee are also planning to follow this event with smaller scale events later in the academic year that are geared specifically towards all Science Students. A committee is currently being assembled to plan the annual multi-day organized event, Science Games.

9) THE NEW VIC PROJECT UPDATE

Dean Lennox stated that in May he reported that the project was in its late stages of approval. Dean Lennox reported that now the project has been approved at the Dossier d'Affaires (DA) has passed in the National Assembly. On October 6th the Project will present the DA for approval to the Board of Governors meeting. If passed, the project will be on its way to completion in Spring 2029.

a) Associate Dean (Academic) Axel Hundemer

Associate Dean Mittermaier reported that delays in acquiring student visas are anticipated and that students should be directed to contact their student advisors.

d) Associate Dean (Research) John Stix

Associate Dean Stix reported that there were no issues in research that were reported and he is available to discuss any research related questions or concerns.
