Rationale: Ensuring students have a basic knowledge of calculus and its use in economic analysis. **ES**

B.Eng. in Materials Engineering Co-Op (148 cr.) – complementary courses deleted, complementary-course note revised, complementary-course note added. *Rationale:* Number of courses students may take outside the Department has increased, so instead of listing them a note was added that specifies 3 credits may be taken outside the Department with appropriate approval. **ES** *Comments/Corrections:* If students take 3 credits from outside the Department, should the first group of Technical Complementaries then read “6 credits from the following”? Indicate an effective term.

M.Sc. in Family Medicine (45 cr.) – required courses deleted, required course added, required-course credits decreased, complementary courses added, complementary-course credits increased, elective-course credits increased.

Rationale: One course’s content divided into three separate courses so that content is clearer, and creating their own epidemiology online course will allow better control of the academic scheduling of the course. **ES**
