

(March 19, 2019 meeting\*, in preparation for Senate meeting of March 27, 2019)

## **1. APPROVAL OF MINUTES OF SENATE**

The minutes of the Senate meeting of February 20, 2019 were circulated to the Steering Committee, and the Steering Committee provided feedback. It is recommended that they now be considered by Senate for approval.

## **2. SPEAKING RIGHTS**

The Steering Committee requests speaking rights for:

- Mr. Bradley Tucker, Executive Director, Analysis, Planning and Budget, for item IIB1 (Budget Planning 2019-2020 Report II); and
- Ms. Diana Dutton, Associate Vice-Principal, Human Resources, for item IIB5.1 (Staffing Report 2017-18).

## **3. APPROVAL OF AGENDA**

The Steering Committee has reviewed the Agenda for the present meeting and recommends it for approval.

## **4. REVIEW OF QUESTIONS AND MOTIONS**

Two questions and one motion were submitted to the Senate Steering Committee for review.

### **4.1 Review of Questions:**

The questions were approved for submission to Senate (as presented to the Steering Committee) and sent to the appropriate Senators for a response.

### **4.2 Review of a Motion:**

The motion, which was submitted by Senators van den Berg and Wilson, concerned making accessible to the McGill community the full contents of all materials submitted to the Senate Steering Committee and subsequently altered or deemed out of order. The Steering Committee had a lengthy discussion on the motion during which various points were raised.

While there was support for adopting processes that would increase transparency and trust, concerns were raised that the motion, as submitted, proposed the implementation of a blanket measure that would be applicable to all Senate documents, without due regard for:

- the quality or appropriateness of the content that would be posted on Senate's website;
- the confidential nature of certain Senate documents (e.g. confidential minutes of HDCC which are approved by Senate Steering on behalf of Senate).

The Steering Committee did not favour accepting the motion for submission to Senate but agreed that the issues raised were important and required further consideration. As such, it was agreed to further explore this motion in the context of a review of the Steering Committee's governance processes, which would involve reviewing the Steering Committee's Terms of Reference and the Senate Standing Rules of Procedure. The Committee will initiate this review in the next governance year.

In the meantime, the Committee noted that individual Senators could share documents they submit to the Steering Committee with other University groups, provided that they are not formatted to appear as official Senate documents. In addition, the Committee suggested that Senators may view the Committee's documents in the Secretariat (provided that prior consent is obtained to share the documents).

Following the Committee's meeting, the Secretary-General and the Chair of Senate met with Senators van den Berg and Wilson to discuss solutions identified by the Steering Committee in response to the motion. The solutions discussed with the Senators were the following:

- The Report of the Steering Committee will provide a fuller account of the Committee's review of questions and motions that are not accepted for inclusion on a Senate agenda;
- The documents submitted to the Steering Committee will be made available to Senators in the Secretariat upon request (provided that prior consent is obtained to share the documents).
- The matters raised by the motion will be studied further in the context of a review of the Steering Committee's governance processes (which will involve reviewing the Steering Committee's terms of reference and the Senate Standing Rules of Procedure) taking place in the next governance year.
- All Senators will be invited to provide comments on this matter in the context of the review.

The Senators agreed to withdraw the motion on the understanding that these measures would be implemented.
