Annual Report 2014-15 (Appendix A)

ACTIVITIES DURING THE ACADEMIC YEAR

This document summarizes the main activities, new initiatives and concerns of McGill University Library for the 2014-15 academic year as discussed at meetings of the Senate Committee on Libraries:

REPORTS were made at each meeting by the Trenholme Dean of Libraries, C. Colleen Cook, on achievements toward meeting the goals in the libraries' strategic plan.

Client Relationship Management

- The Osler Library renovations took longer than expected, which meant that the collection was stored in a reading room in McLennan Library, where users could access them. Renovations were completed by January 6, 2015, and the Osler Library is again open for use.
- An announcement from Libraries that e-material would migrate from Classic Catalogue to WorldCat Local (WCL) set off a strong reaction from researchers in the Humanities and prompted a petition.
 - o Libraries acknowledge communications issues and are working towards possible solutions, however this decision presents an ongoing challenge; data suggest WCL may be surpassing the Classic Catalogue in terms of functionality.
- Questions about raising funds for a new library space were discussed; it was acknowledged that philanthropy and the cultivation of valuable relationships will play a big role and that effective fundraising is key to the success of this project.
- Whiteboards placed on the main floor of McLennan for users to provide feedback have proved a big success. The issues that appeared most often were about the library bathrooms, and the Redpath doors (more on these later in this report).
- Recent focus groups relating to the Library Feasibility Study found that students will use
 whichever library is most convenient, regardless of discipline and that students reported
 spending 45-90% of their study time in a campus library. These findings reinforce the need for
 better/more spaces for students.

Collection Management

• Open Access was a much-discussed topic this year, and will continue to be, with the new mandate from the federal tri-agency councils (CIHR, NSERC and SSHRC). The mandate states that all peer-reviewed material published that is supported by tri-agency research funds must be submitted to a repository and made available to the public within 12 months of publication.

- o McGill Libraries has a repository set up and ready for this purpose.
- Associate Dean (Digital Initiatives) Jenn Riley, her staff, and the office of Research & International Relations will be working with researchers to assist them in complying with the new Tri-council rules.
- The need for a campus-wide policy <u>on all research</u> funded by non tri-agency councils was identified.
- Preservation of the Collections Budget in the face of the eroding value of Canadian dollars vs.
 US dollars is an ongoing issue, however, University support for this is very high, and the Library
 was able to maintain the volume of acquistions and subscriptions to serial publications this fiscal
 year. McGill remains in the top third of libraries in the ARL (Association of Research Libraries)
 in terms of collections.

Facilities, Resources, Infrastructure Management

- Recent construction projects, completed and ongoing include:
 - o Osler Library HVAC system replacement completed in January 2015.
 - o Ongoing investigation into structural integrity issues in the Schulich Library, including problems with crumbling masonry and water leaks.
 - o Redpath Terrace: the smoke-free terrace, while still not completely smoke-free, shows marked improvement.
- Due to insufficient budget to hire additional security guards, the doors to the Redpath library will remain closed indefinitely, and will only be used as emergency exits. After many questions from users, clear signage is now in place indicating this change.
- Budget from the SSMU Library Improvement Fund was allocated and matched by Library funds to renovate the bathrooms in the Redpath Library. Men's, women's, and gender-neutral spaces are provided, along with baby-changing stations. The spaces are universally accessible.
- The Feasbility Study has progressed (and is actually completed), with the hire of a Boston-based architectural firm (Shepley-Bullfinch) with Quebec partners EKM.
 - o The consultants have visited the libraries several times and held focus groups in order to get a sense of how and how *much* the space is used.
 - O Book storage is a main issue, and two options are favoured: 1) on site high-density storage with robotic retrieval, and 2) storage at Mac campus with a one-day delivery timeframe.
 - o Plans include an unveiling of the existing Victorian details on Redpath Hall that are presently hidden behind the 1950's Redpath addition.
