ACTIVITIES DURING THE ACADEMIC YEAR

This document summarizes the activities of the McGill University Library for the 2016-17 academic year as discussed at meetings of the Senate Committee on Libraries.

Activity reports were made at each meeting by the Trenholme Dean of Libraries on achievements toward meeting the goals stated in the libraries' strategic plan.

1. Client Relationships

- A number of improvements were made in the Library last year, including more seating for users and a new computer lab in Schulich, installation of electronic device charging stations, and a card swipe system for after-hours access. The Arts Undergraduate Society funded the installation of several wellness-promoting features in the Humanities and Social Sciences Library (HSSL), including standing workstations, a stationary bike, and a treadmill.
- A trial project for a self-serve, cloud-based app was launched in winter 2017: meeScan allows the user to check out books using a smart phone, tablet or library-provided iPad.
- The Library opted not to lower the heat by a few degrees in the evenings in HSSL, as was proposed by the Office of Sustainability. It was agreed that this would compromise the level of comfort for students.
- 'Schulich Library of Science and Engineering' was renamed to 'Schulich Library of Physical Sciences, Life Sciences, and Engineering'. 2. Collection Management and Open Access

- The collection budget was once again maintained this year.
- Dean Cook reported that with the rise of the Open Access movement, sites like SciHub are becoming more popular.
- Joseph Hafner, Associate Dean, Collection Services, attended the annual general meeting for HathiTrust, a digitized library based at the University of Michigan. He reported that thanks to a grant, HathiTrust has been able to digitize many more works that are in the public domain. These new digitized documents are accessible through the McGill Library.
- Jeffry Archer was appointed as the new Associate Dean, User Services, in January 2017. He has experience with book storage facilities, and will connect to students, staff, and faculty regarding what this new system could mean to these groups.

3. Facilities, Resources, Infrastructure Management

- The filling of vacant support staff positions improves the quality of user services delivered by the Library. Both students and academic staff remarked this. There is an ongoing recruitment backlog due to movement of library staff for promotions, leaves, and retirements.
- Preliminary restoration work of the structural walls of the Macdonald-Stewart Library Building, which houses the Schulich Library of Physical Sciences, Life Sciences and Engineering, started last year and is still ongoing, with the main work expected to begin in spring 2018.
- In December 2016, a Cyclical Unit Review (CUR) was done in Rare & Special Collections, Osler, Art, and Archives (ROAAr). The report recommended centralizing the physical location of all university archives and also the staff of the ROAAr Unit.

- McGill Library continues to work with other universities in Quebec to create a shared software
 platform in an effort to streamline resources and work more collaboratively with each other. A
 proposal for government funding was submitted and not yet reviewed as of April 2017. McGill
 Library would have to match its cataloging system in French to work within any shared system
 with other Quebec institutions.
- Fiat Lux fundraising efforts have been ongoing thanks to a group of very dedicated volunteers.

TERMS OF REFERENCE OF THE COMMITTEE

The Committee on Libraries is a Standing Committee of Senate with the following specific areas of responsibility.

Specific Areas of Responsibility

The Committee shall:

- 1. Recommend to Senate, as appropriate, broad policies concerning the Library in support of the University's strategic plans and academic priorities.
- 2. Review and advise on planning documents and reports as they relate to the Library and advise Senate and others, as appropriate, on library and information service developments which are of academic significance to the University.
- 3. Review resource allocation policies as they relate to the Library's strategic plan.
- 4. Facilitate and advise on communication between the University community and the Library.
- 5. Meet at least twice per semester during the academic year and submit an annual report to Senate.
