ISSUE: New degree titles

- Master of Science, Applied, in Occupational Therapy
M.Sc.A.(O.T.)
- Master of Science, Applied, in Physical Therapy
M.Sc.A.(P.T.)

BACKGROUND: The above-cited degree programs were approved by Senate on 4th December 2002. They were subsequently submitted to CREPUQ's *Commission d'évaluation des projets de programmes* for evaluation and to the Ministry of Education, Leisure and Sport (MELS) for approval. They were approved by MELS on 2nd November 2006.

MOTION OR RESOLUTION FOR APPROVAL:

On recommendation by the Academic Policy and Planning Committee, Senate on 4th December 2002 approved the new degree designation

- Master of Science, Applied, in Occupational Therapy
- Master of Science, Applied, in Physical Therapy

These new degree designations now require additions to the *Statutes*. In accordance with Article 15.1 of the University *Statutes*, I hereby submit the following motion to amend the *Statutes*:

Be it resolved that Senate recommends to the Board of Governors that Article 13.1 of the Statutes be amended as indicated below:

13.1 *The following are the degrees granted by the University in course:*

<u><i>Master of Science, Applied, in Occupational Therapy</i></u>	<u><i>M.Sc.A.(O.T.)</i></u>
<u><i>Master of Science, Applied, in Physical Therapy</i></u>	<u><i>M.Sc.A.(P.T.)</i></u>
<i>Master of Social Work</i>	<i>M.S.W.</i>
<i>Master of Urban Planning</i>	<i>M.U.P.</i>

RATIONALE: Amendment of the University Statutes is necessary for McGill University to be allowed to confer the said new degrees.
