ISSUE: Progress report on the Library Expanded Course Reserve Service after one

year of operation.

BACKGROUND

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RATIONALE:

Students asked, "Why do I have to purchase a courspack when the teaching material required by our professors has already been purchased by the

Library". The Expanded Course Reserve service was developed to answer this

question.

The SSMU Library Improvement Fund provided \$40,000 to develop the service and pilot the program in the Fall of 2009. This evolved into a library wide service which involves close collaboration between faculty, our liason librarians, library staff and the Mcgill Bookstore to support teaching and learning at McGill. This presentation addresses the service structure now in place, outlines the benefits to students and faculty and proposes further collaborative opportunities between faculty and librarians.

To support the teaching initiatives of McGill faculty by ensuring that any item owned by the Library from any course materials list is linked in the Course Reserves module of the Library Catalogue.

Student funded pilot project

- SSMU Library Improvement Fund
 - 2008 summer project \$40,000
 - Collaborate with Bookstore for coursepack feed
- Fully implemented in all branches since Winter 2009
 - All areas of the Library involved
 - Liaison Librarians and Library Assistants working collaboratively in teams
 - Collection Services & Library Technology Services

- Students have easier access to essential course materials, anywhere, anytime
- Students now have choices
 - Buy the coursepack
 - Access the material online
- Coursepacks should become smaller and cost less:

Average cost:

2009 - \$33.03

2010 - \$30.57

Average Size:

2009 - 307 pages

2010 – 320 pages





Expanded Course Reserves Benefits

- Fantastic opportunity for collaboration between Liaison Librarians and faculty
 - Targeted collection development
 - If we do not own it we will buy it
 - Electronic version is purchased (as well as print, depending on your needs)
 - No need to create links Library staff handle this task
 - No need to risk copyright infringement The Library has licensed the material





Faculty / Library considerations

- Superb opportunity to work with the Library to review content and sources prior to creating a coursepack.
 - Rethink the need for a coursepack
 - Reduce the size of the coursepack and reproduce nonelectronic content only
