ISSUE:	Update on the Quartier de l'Innovation
BACKGROUND & RATIONALE:	In 2010, McGill and École de technologie supérieure (ÉTS) embarked upon a collaboration to create a unique innovation hub and urban environment in the heart of downtown Montreal, called the Quartier de l'innovation (QI). Today, the QI is becoming a reality. The initiative aims to leverage McGill's research and training strengths in order to forge partnerships between academia, students, community organizations, and government, as well as to develop the means to promote innovation and entrepreneurship across all sectors, based on the QI's four pillars: Industrial, Education and Research, Social and Cultural, and Urban. The QI is an important McGill initiative that is part of our goal to transform our approach to innovation, public service, and the intersections between the two. Senators can act as advocates for the project, and we wish to keep them
	well informed about major QI initiatives and accomplishments. To this aim, Dr. Rose Goldstein, Vice-Principal (Research and International Relations), will share details on the progress being made in relation to the QI's governance, mandates, and community engagement. In particular, she will highlight past QI-related events such as the Montreal Summits on Innovation, and the QI official launch, which takes place on May 13; the support of student and community leaders (e.g. Students Working Group and QI Ambassadors); initiatives to identify the QI's concentrations (e.g. in culture, urban planning, social innovation, industrial partnerships, etc.); and concrete projects that are now underway or in development (e.g. BioFuelNet Canada, incubation infrastructures for students, the Centre for Aerospace Professional Education, etc.). Dr. Goldstein will also briefly review the creation of a new Standing Committee on Innovation, which will be chaired by Dr. Phil Barker, who led the initial internal QI planning committee and is now a member of the QI Steering Committee.

The QI is located in an area:


- Renowned as an dynamic industrial hub in the 19th century

INCUBATION

Centech has now opened its programs to the McGill entrepreneurial community.

- Technological incubator located in the QI, created by ÉTS in the 1990s
- Now welcomes applications from McGill students, graduates, and researchers
- Two start-up created since January 2013:
 - Temperpak led by three students from the Faculty of Engineering, launched in February
 - Percutaneous Mitral Valve Repair led by Dr. Renzo Cecere and one student, launched in April



The Social Economy Initiative (SEI) is working closely with QI to engage and strengthen social economy organizations in the community surrounding the district:

- Desautels Faculty of Management is integrating social entrepreneurship and innovation into its teaching, research, and outreach.
- New training and collaborations with local partners and nonprofits, such as Impact Internships
- An I-Lab in social innovation, incubation in social entrepreneurship, and securing funds dedicated to social economy and social innovation





LABORATORY OF URBAN CULTURE

Under the leadership of Prof. Will Straw, the Laboratory of Urban Culture will be a place where:

- The community and artists can share knowledge and expertise.
- Artists can exhibit their works.
- Universities can showcase the talents of their students and researchers.
- The community as a whole can benefit from the QI's innovative and creative activities.



URBAN PLANNING IN THE QI

Under the leadership of Prof. Raphaël Fischler, urban planning in the QI is focusing on specific projects, including:

- Innovation in energy use in the built environment
- Indicators of urban sustainability and innovation (collaborations with the City of Montreal)
- Urban food systems (collaborations with Macdonald Campus)
- Urban ICT applications





NEW TRAINING PROGRAMS

CAPE: Centre for Aerospace Professional Education

- New joint program between ÉTS and McGill, pre-launched January 31
- Provides ongoing professional development through high-level non-credit continuing education
- Designed for engineers and professionals in the Quebec aerospace sector
- Focused on the companies hiring aerospace professionals in Quebec or internationally
