Introduction

The *Policy on Safe Disclosure*, approved by Senate and the Executive Committee of the Board of Governors (see Senate minutes (23 May 2007, Minute 6) and Board of Governors minutes (30 October 2007, Minute 7), amended 20 January 2010, Minute 3.3), came into force on 30 October 2007.

The Policy calls for the Secretary-General to report annually to Senate on the application of the Policy. This report is presented to Senate in discharge of this obligation for the period 1 November 2011 through 31 October 2012.

Report

During the twelve-month period from 1 November 2011 through 31 October 2012, no reports utilizing the process established by the *Policy on Safe Disclosure* have been filed with the Secretary-General (or any other member of the senior administration of the University).

Based on suggestions received during the year, the website will be redesigned to improve access to the policy and form for filing a report.
