B.Com.; General Management; Concentration in Managing for Sustainability (15 cr.)

At a meeting on 21st November 2013, APC reviewed and approved a proposal from the Desautels Faculty of Management to create a Bachelor of Commerce Major in General Management Concentration in Managing for Sustainability. The program responds to a growing demand for managers and professionals who have the conceptual and analytical skills needed to formulate and implement organizational policies that contribute to ecologically sustainable and socially responsible economic development. As organizations increasingly put sustainability issues on their agenda, managers must be able to incorporate social and environmental considerations into business activities and work with stakeholders to generate innovative solutions that transcend rather than accept trade-offs between environmental, social and economic values. This

concentration complements the existing B.Com. programs and traditional management career paths, by introducing students to the principles of sustainability and developing the key skills needed to integrate business strategies with sustainability objectives. New sustainability-focused courses in accounting, information systems, operations and systems thinking have been included in the program.

B. Com.; Managing for Sustainability; Major (39 cr.)

At a meeting on 21st November 2013, APC reviewed and approved a proposal from the Desautels Faculty of Management to create a Bachelor of Commerce Major in Managing for Sustainability. The significant ecological, social and economic issues with which society is now wrestling and the major challenges confronting contemporary managers are closely related. The program responds to a growing demand for sustainability managers and professionals in the private sector, consultancies, government agencies, NGOs, and international organizations - managers who combine traditional business skills with environmental knowledge and an understanding of social systems and stakeholder expectations. The green economy is growing quickly and will be an important source of innovation and jobs in the coming years. While sustainability is a key component of McGill's academic priorities, leading business and management schools around the world have already launched courses, programs and centres to integrate sustainability into their curricula. This new Major is designed for students who wish to combine managerial and business knowledge with a solid understanding of the interlinked economic, social and ecological challenges of achieving sustainability. It integrates management studies with fundamentals of environmental science and sustainability, and is offered in collaboration with the McGill School of Environment and the Department of Geography.
