Dr. Christopher J. MacKinnon Ph.D. is lecturer in the Department of Oncology at McGill University. He is a counselling psychologist at the Balfour M. Mount Palliative Care Unit, McGill University Health Center. He is in private practice in Montreal.

Course description:

Bereavement psychotherapy can be a complex therapeutic enterprise requiring competence and expertise in assessment, treatment planning, and intervention skills.

This clinical seminar introduces *meaning-reconstruction* theory- a contemporary model of bereavement psychotherapy- to highlight skills needed in assessment, diagnosis and treatment of the various trajectories of bereavement. Attention will be given to the type and circumstances of death as determinants of case conceptualization and intervention.
