# > SHORT TERM DYNAMIC PSYCHOTHERAPY - SEMINAR SUPERVISION @ THE ARGYLE

This series will present Short-Term Dynamic Psychotherapy, both theory and technique. Participants must be either licensed mental health professionals or full-time students enrolled in an accredited graduate program leading to a degree as a mental health professional.

<u>Trainer</u>: Dr. Steven Sandler, Dr. Sandler is a psychiatrist at Albany Medical Center, New York, who works in the field of individual psychotherapy. He has been practising and teaching an approach called Short Term Dynamic Psychotherapy (STDP). This approach involves the therapist's active focus on the patient's defenses, with the therapeutic goal of experiencing blocked emotions associated with disturbing events from the past. In recent years, clinicians working with this model have emphasized the factor of emotional experience while at the same time de-emphasizing treatment time.

Dr. Sandler believes that the best outcomes occur when a patient can not only talk about his emotions, but fully experience them. Research is accumulating that confirms the efficacy of this approach

# > MITACS FUNDING FOR COLLABORATIVE INTERNATIONAL RESEARCH IN INDIA, FRANCE AND TUNISIA

Mitacs just launched a new program to support student mobility between Canadian universities and Indian Institutes of Technology (IIT).

# GRADUATE STUDENT/POSTDOCTORAL FELLOW SECTION OF CHILD MALTREATMENT EDITORIAL BOARD – CALL FOR PAPERS

Child Maltreatment (CM) is seeking outstanding graduate students, interns, or postdoctoral fellows to serve as members of the Student Section of reviewers, which is adjunctive to the CM Editorial Board. The Student Section provides students an opportunity to gain experience in the scientific peer review and publication processes. Student Section members provide anonymous manuscript reviews under the supervision of a faculty mentor. Once the student review is approved by the faculty mentor, it is included in the journal's decision and feedback process and forwarded to authors. As with all CM reviewers, students then receive anonymous copies of all other reviews of the manuscript, so that they may compare their analysis and comments with those of recognized experts in the field. Student Section members are encouraged to attend and participate in Editorial Board meetings and discussions, but do not serve as Board members. They are expected to complete up to four reviews a year.

A total of six students will be selected to serve 2-year terms from 1-1-2016 through 12-31-2017. Applications are encouraged from students, interns, and postdoctoral fellows of diverse backgrounds and professional disciplines, including psychology, social work, medicine, law, criminal justice, and other areas related to child maltreatment. At the beginning of their term as reviewers, students must have at least two years remaining under the supervision of their faculty mentors in their graduate or fellowship programs.

Applicants are asked to submit, on line (childmaltreatment@gsu.edu), a single PDF document that includes the applicant's CV, statement of interest, and faculty mentor's letter of support. The student statement should describe professional area(s) of interest and goals for a two year term as student reviewer with CM (no more than

2 pages, double spaced, 12 point font). The faculty mentor's letter should indicate the qualifications of the student applicant and the willingness to supervise up to four reviews a year. **Application materials are due on November 15, 2015.** We anticipate announcement of student selection will be made in by the end of December 2015.

# **POSITION SUMMARY:**

McGill University and the Centre for Research on Children and Families (CRCF) invites applications for a Postdoctoral Fellow position funded through the *Building research capacity with First Nations and mainstream youth protection services in Quebec* (BRC) initiative, a Social Sciences and Humanities Research Council Partnership Grant. In addition to pursuing their own program of research in child welfare, the Fellowship researcher will collaborate with faculty and graduate students on activities related to the BRC initiative focusing on examining the dynamics and outcomes of child welfare services; supporting the research capacity of child welfare agencies; developing expertise in analytical methods using administrative data within a participatory research framework; and mentoring graduate students involved with the BRC program. If appropriate, the Postdoctoral Fellow can take the opportunity to teach an intro-level seminar on statistics.

## **ADDITIONAL REQUIREMENTS:**

# SENIOR SOCIAL WORKER (FULL-TIME, PERMANENT) - PHOENIX SUPPORTIVE HOUSING PROGRAM

**Job Summary**: This position will work within the Supportive Housing Program, which is comprised of two residential programs that offer long-term housing for youth aged 16-24. Phoenix House is a ten-bed co-ed residence. Through 24/7 support, it offers safe, supportive housing for youth learning skills for independent living. The Supervised Apartment Program is a program for ten youth living in three homes that are transitioning from semi-independent living with on-site staff to independent living.

This new program brings two existing programs together and requires a social worker who can effectively support program development and change management to help lead their unity into a continuum of services. Under the supervision of the Coordinator, the Senior Social Worker is responsible for providing supportive counselling and case management to ten youth residing in the Supervised Apartment Program and overseeing the case management responsibilities of four staff members at Phoenix House.
