NOTICE OF RESEARCH:

> CALL FOR PAPERS - Canada: Homeland or Hostile Land?

"Canada is the homeland of equality, justice, and tolerance" (Kim Campbell, 1993).

Or is it? As Canada approaches the 150th anniversary of Confederation, it is important to ask: how are the colonialism, racism, sexism, and other social and economic disparities that characterized the founding of this country still embedded in our society? The Robarts Centre for (Critical) Canadian Studies welcomes exploration of these topics from multiple and competing perspectives at its annual conference on April 28th and 29th, 2016 at York University in Toronto. Graduate students are invited to submit proposals for presentations that examine themes of inequality in Canada: the goal of this two-day conference is to provide a space for discussions of inequality in Canada broadly defined; we thus encourage students from a wide variety of disciplines to interpret this theme. Potential topics may

include, but are not limited to: the legacies, experiences, or expressions of Canadians whose social locations vary on the basis of gender, race, indigeneity, ability, socio-economic status, region, or migration status. Reimbursement of travel costs will be made available for students attending the entire conference from outside of the Greater Toronto Area. CONFERENCE DESCRIPTION

Designed as an adjudicated, peer-reviewed academic forum for undergraduate, graduate, and professional program students, Crossroads is a unique opportunity for students to showcase and engage in dialogue about their innovative health research. Emphasizing the importance of interdisciplinary exchange, the conference welcomes submissions from a wide range of health-related disciplines. The mission of the Crossroads Conference is to advance the understanding of health through interdisciplinary research. Crossroads provides workshops and networking opportunities on March 11th and adjudicated student presentations on the March 12th, with keynote speeches on both days.

GUIDELINES FOR SUBMISSION

- Abstract summary (250 words or less not including title, authors, and section headings) must be submitted by email to hahpgss@gmail.com in Word Document format (.doc or .docx)
- > Submission of the abstract constitutes permission for the conference organizers to publish the abstracts in either printed or electronic format.
- Please indicate at the bottom of your abstract whether you would like to present orally or with a poster. Those who are not chosen for oral presentations will be given the option of presenting a poster.
- Abstracts that do not meet the required format will not be considered.

SUBMISSION DEADLINE: January 15, 2016. REGISTRATION

- Registration is open to students and professionals who wish to attend.
- > The deadline for abstract submission will be January 15, 2016
- The early bird registration is open from February 5-12, 2016
 The final registration deadline is February 19, 2016
