> M-J MILLOY: "ENDING HIV/AIDS" CONFERENCE CO-HOSTED BY THE MCGILL SCHOOL OF SOCIAL WORK

On behalf of the Concordia HIV/AIDS Project and Dr. Thomas Waugh, we invite you to the final lecture of the 2015-2016 Concordia University Community Lecture Series on HIV/AIDS by research scientist, M-J Milloy of the BC Centre for Excellence in HIV/AIDS.

Join us at **McGill University, at Leacock 26** on **Thursday, March 10th** at **7pm** for an exploration of the history of the HIV/AIDS outbreak in Vancouver's Downtown Eastside - including its roots in government policies such as drug prohibitionism, macroeconomic transitions and changes in patterns of drug consumption. M-J will be outlining the effects of recent public health- based interventions, such as the scale up of sterile syringe distribution and the opening of North America's first sanctioned supervised injection facility, on the pandemic amongst people who use injection drugs living in the neighborhood.

We are also happy to announce a corresponding workshop on Friday, March 11th from 3-5pm (venue TBA) with M-J Milloy and Sandhia Vadlamudy, the executive director of CACTUS Montreal.

In this interactive workshop Sandhia and M-J will further discuss the necessity of harm reduction services to people who use drugs and to HIV prevention - with Sandhia offering insights into the Montreal situation, and the current legal battle over supervised injection sites in Quebec.
