ARTS BANTING FELLOWSHIP COMPETITION 2015

The Faculty of Arts will once again be conducting an internal competition to select its Banting Postdoctoral Fellowship applicants. Applicants and prospective supervisors must complete all parts of the Banting application. The *prospective McGill supervisors* of Banting applicants should *e-mail* applications to our office at sarah.kaderabek@mcgill.ca by 5pm on Monday, **August 10, 2015**. Please attach all documents to the e-mail as a single PDF file.

Note that as these are extremely competitive fellowships (only 70 will be awarded in all fields across all of Canada); supervisors should choose their nominees with care. In keeping with the intention of the call for applications, supervisors should not nominate current McGill graduate students to hold a Banting at McGill. The Banting fellowship program is open to both national and international students. Applicants must have fulfilled all degree requirements for a PhD on a date within the eligibility window of September 23, 2012, through August 15, 2016. Graduate and Postdoctoral Studies has established a quota for each Faculty based on current postdoctoral enrollment; as such, the Faculty of Arts will select 3 applications to forward to the national competition. Prospective supervisors and applicants will be notified of the selection committee's decision by August 17, 2015.

Once applicants have been selected, the Dean's office will work with prospective applicants and their supervisors and units to fine tune the applications. Once completed, we will send the full applications to GPS by their internal deadline of August 31. GPS will review and approve the applications, and provide applicants with the Institutional Letter of Endorsement in time to meet the final Banting application deadline of September 23. Based on feedback from GPS, applicants may be required to make modifications to their applications before the final deadline.
