



PRE-REQUISITE COURSE DESCRIPTIONS

Applicants to the Master of Science Applied in Couple and Family Therapy are required to demonstrate completion of the following four pre-requisite course taken at the university level (3-credits each) and submit the corresponding course syllabi. The courses can be completed at either the undergraduate or graduate level.
