## A Road Map for Change: Pedagogy

#### Strategic Objective #1:

 Integrate Decolonization, Indigenization, Equity, Diversity, Inclusion, Anti-Racism, Anti-Oppression, Anti-Ableism across the SSW curriculum

#### Actions:

- Action 1: Conduct a thorough methodologically rigorous scoping review of colonial, white-centered, decolonial, anti-racist, anti-oppressive, LGTBQ2IA+, and disability focused objectives, pedagogy, frameworks, assessment, and content in the SSW Curriculum (all programs)
- Action 2: Engage in a process of syllabi revision in order to increase representation of BIPOC and equity- seeking groups critical perspectives in syllabi objectives/theoretical frameworks/assessment/content





## A Road Map for Change: Student Engagement & Research

- Strategic Objective #2 (Student Engagement)
  - Provide opportunities for QTBIPOC, disabled, and equity-seeking group students to participate in equity, diversity, indigenization, anti-racism, LGBTQ2IA+, disability, and anti-oppression initiatives within the University
- Strategic Objective #1 (Research):
  - Provide opportunities for students to participate in equity, diversity, decolonization, indigenization, and anti-racist research initiatives with and about BIPOC and equity-seeking groups within the SSW.





## A road map for change: BSW Required Courses Syllabi Review

- Mapping exercise of the curricula of the school
  - Make EDDII objectives actionable by identifying areas of overlap, duplication, gaps, and opportunities for change in course syllabi and across programs
  - Identify the range of pedagogical, assessment, and content trends across programs and the School





## A road map for change: Required Courses Syllabi Review

- Hired 5 BIPOC & equity-seeking group member students from BSW & PhD programs
- Data extraction focused on three areas:
  - Pedagogy in course design:
    - ✓ Course structure
    - ✓ Classroom and field activities
    - ✓ Assignment type: Papers, presentations, group work, journals
  - Sources of knowledge
    - ✓ Assigned Readings (journal article, podcasts, other media, etc.)
    - ✓ Guest lecturers
  - Representation through authorship, topic, discipline





# BSW Required Courses Syllabi Review Fall 2022 & Winter 2023

- Faculty Retreat May 2022 followed by ongoing meetings of three working groups:
  - Practice
  - Community & policy
  - Mental health

#### Actions

- o Identify and remove redundancies in required readings and content
- Increase cross-course content synergy through scaffolding learning
- Increase EDDI-related content in assigned readings and diversification of pedagogical approaches





#### **Next Steps**

- Working groups continue to meet and make coordinated revisions to syllabi
- Review of the content and authorship of required readings forthcoming from the syllabi review
- Establishment of a regular curricula review structure, as per the EDDII Strategic Plan
- Ongoing focus on decolonization and indigenization of the curricula, e.g., Gord Bruyere, an Indigenous Curriculum Specialist, workshops with instructors in October 2022
