Project Awards (Research, Service or Demonstration) and Field Education Awards

The School of Social Work has four available student **Project Awards**, funded by generous friends & graduates. Unlike scholarships or fellowships (for recruitment of incoming students) and prizes (for recognition of graduating students), these awards are intended to provide modest <u>financial support for special projects</u> undertaken by students <u>during</u> their social work programs:

Freda L. Paltiel Award (value: \$1921.51):

For immigrant & minority women's health & development All Social Work students & faculty are eligible

Tryna Rotholz Annual Creative Award (value: \$1318.08):

For social group work practice

Upper level social work students in good academic standing are eligible.

Joan Macfarlane Bailin Research Award (value: \$1541.78):

For projects related to aging and/or the aged

Applicants must have completed one full year of study in the McGill School of Social Work.

Jane Harris Van-Gelder Award (value: \$716.09):

For Social Work students to undertake activities in the area of social work and health including mental health.

There are also two **Field Education Awards**:

Theodora H. Lambert Award (value: \$2,608.70):

For BSW, MSW and MScA-CFT students currently (2022-23) in practicum working with people with physical disabilities to attend a training or conference related to their field placement (ex. CASWE).

Shirley Pfefer Award (value: \$394.43):

For a student at BSW, MSW, MScA-CFT level whose current (2022-23) field placement relates to palliative care (budget not required)
