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1. Faculty Research Accomplishments

Myriam Denov Recipient of a 2020 Killam Research Fellowship

Professor Myriam Denov, Canada Research Chair in Youth, Gender and Armed Conflict received a 2020 Killam Research Fellowship to support her work examining **the needs of children born of war in northern Uganda**. Professor Denov is the <u>first social work researcher</u> to receive a Killam Research Fellowship in the award's 50+-year history. Read all about it <u>here</u>.

Professor Delphine Collin-Vezina Awarded a SSHRC Partnership Grant

Professor Delphine Collin-Vezina has been awarded a <u>\$2.5 million SSHRC Partnership</u> grant over 7 years to support the **Canadian Consortium on Child Trauma and Trauma-Informed Care**. This Partnership unites 39 co-applicants (including Kate Maurer and Mike MacKenzie from our School), 18 collaborators (including Wanda Gabriel and Ben Geboe from our school), and 43 partner organizations from across Canada. This consortium aims to improve the quality of life and trajectories of trauma-impacted children and youth by expanding social responses to child trauma across provinces, linguistic and service sectors, disciplines, and mandates.

Professor Collin-Vezina has also been awarded a grant from the Quebec Ministry of Health and Social Services to support a project to assist social workers to quickly identify and intervene to address economic and associated health and social hardships experienced by **vulnerable families during the COVID-19** pandemic crisis.

Professor Nicole Ives has been awarded a SSHRC funded Child and Youth Refugee Research Coalition research grant to examined **COVID-19 and Refugee Families in Montreal**.

2. Student Scholarship Success

This has been a particularly fruitful year for School of Social Work student research scholarships: ten MSW students and two PhD students have been awarded SSHRC graduate scholarships. In addition, two more PhD students were awarded FRQSC scholarships. Congratulations!
