

Indiana University School of Social Work TENURE-TRACK FACULTY POSITION AVAILABLE (Bloomington campus) IN_SOCW 13006

The Indiana University School of Social Work invites applications for a tenure-track position at the assistant or associate professor level. The position is available on the Bloomington campus and will begin August, 2014. This is a ten-month appointment with responsibility for teaching, research, and service. Successful candidates will be expected to teach across the BSW curricula as well as occasional classes in IU-partner campus locations.

Essential qualifications include an earned doctorate in social work or a related field, an MSW degree from a CSWE-accredited program, and at least two years of post-MSW practice experience. Successful candidates should also have a well-articulated research and publication agenda as well as demonstrated interest in seeking external grants to support scholarly activities. Candidates for the title of Associate Professor must demonstrate a history of external grants and scholarly publications to merit appointment at this level. Preference will be given to applicants who demonstrate teaching experience at the BSW level, and have demonstrated interest in online and distance education delivery methods.

Salary is competitive and commensurate with qualifications and experience.

The Indiana University School of Social Work (IUSSW), headquartered in Indianapolis, has a long and distinguished history that began in 1911. IUSSW offers the BSW, MSW and PhD in Social Work and the AS and BS in Labor Studies. The School has approximately 65 full-time faculty members on seven campuses. The School enrolls nearly 1,500 students in its programs statewide. The Bloomington campus, located about an hour south of Indianapolis is a large traditional university campus of exceptional beauty with an undergraduate social work program consisting of 6 full-time faculty and approximately 10 part-time faculty members. The campus includes a large international student population and a world-renowned music school, contributing to its rich cultural environment.
