List all volunteer work experiences or community activities that involved a substantial commitment in the past 5 years.

Include only activities that lasted more than one week, or that involved a recurrent commitment. Community involvement can include activities such as competitive sports (e.g. varsity or provincial-level competition) or music (e.g. performance and/or orchestral) that requires a substantial time commitment and community involvement beyond the organization itself.
