

# 2023-2024 IN-COURSE ATHLETIC AWARDS COMPETITION

The following awards, valued at \$2,000 each, are granted by the Committee on Enrolment and Student Affairs (CESA) and The Martlet Foundation on the basis of academic performance and leadership qualities demonstrated during the 2022-2023 academic year. Awards will be granted to those who best reflect the characteristics of service, dedication and teamwork.

## 1938 Champions Awards

Established in 1989 with generous contributions from the surviving members of the 1938 McGill Intercollegiate Champions in football and hockey in memory of their teammates, Massey Beveridge, Perry Foster, Jimmy Hall, Joey Jacobson, Russell McConnell, Ben Stevenson and Fred Wigle, who lost their lives in the service of their country during World War II.

#### T. Palmer Howard Memorial Award

Established in 2002 by Catherine Howard in memory of her husband, T. Palmer Howard (B.A.1931, B.C.L.1934), one of the founders of The Martlet Foundation. Preference will be given to members of the Swimming Teams.

#### **Dorothy A. Nichol Scholarships**

Established in 2000 through a generous gift from Dorothy A. Nichol, B.Sc. (P.E.) 1949, who was a student leader, women's basketball coach 1949-1952, Professor in the Faculty of Education 1952-1989, and Director of Women's Athletics at Macdonald College 1955-1970. The scholarship is in recognition of her life-long commitment to and encouragement of women's athletics in Canada.

An applicant must meet all of the following conditions:

- 1. have been a full-time student in a degree program at McGill University for the 2022-2023 year and
- 2. must be registered at McGill for the 2023-2024 year as full-time degree student and
- 3. high academic achievement (at least a 3.30 on the combined GPA for all courses taken in the Fall and Winter terms) and
- 4. leadership in student or community affairs or athletics related to the McGill community.

Each applicant must provide 2 letters of reference; at least one must be from an individual who can attest to the significance of the contribution(s) to student life at McGill University. As an example, the president of an organization, team coach, or chair of a committee is an individual who can be approached to provide a reference letter. Reference letters must be sent electronically to <a href="mailto:scholarships@mcgill.ca">scholarships@mcgill.ca</a> directly by the referees.

The completed application, including the two letters of reference, **MUST** be received by the Scholarships and Student Aid Office (SSAO), **NO LATER THAN** MONDAY, OCTOBER 16, 2023. Documents must be submitted electronically to scholarships@mcgill.ca
