Official In-Course Scholarships

Process

- Awarded on the basis of achievement at the end of the academic year. Paid to undergraduate students continuing full-time in the same undergraduate program the next academic year.
- Must have completed 27 graded credits or 14 graded credits if registered for only one term.
- Determined by the Faculty Scholarship Committees (FSC) that meet at the end of the Winter term once final grades are submitted. The FSCs tend to meet between May & June when they can tackle both convocation and in-course awarding.
- Decisions are communicated by the Faculty to recipients in the Summer months, typically in July.
- Default disbursement schedule and payment method:
 Awards are split 50% for Fall/Winter and paid to the student's fee account.

Processing Deadline/Constraints

Typically submitted for processing between June & August.

NOTE: 3-term programs usually submit between **September & October** (The FSC must wait for the grades of the Summer session to assess academic performance).

- In-course scholarships are entered from June 1st to October 31st. Typically submitted before August to ensure the award is deposited to the fee account before Fall fees are due.
- This ensures that the scholarship is accurately reflected on the student's transcript at the end of the reference period.
- NOTE: As of November 1st, UG processors can still enter incourse scholarships but the scholarship will appear in the wrong section of the transcript i.e. end of Fall term. Notify Student Funding in such instances.
