Position description

The Department of Surgery, Division of Plastic and Reconstructive Surgery at the McGill University Health Centre (MUHC) is inviting applications for a full-time position at the rank of Assistant or Associate Professor (Clinical). The professorial rank will be determined according to the candidate's qualifications and experience. The anticipated start date is flexible, with a target start date of summer or fall 2023. This is a Contract Academic Staff position and does not confer eligibility for tenure.

The successful candidate will join an active and high-volume academic breast and oncologic reconstruction practice at the Royal Victoria Hospital, one of the three core teaching sites of the MUHC and McGill Plastic Surgery Residency Program located in the new Glen Site in downtown Montreal. This state-of-the-art facility is fully affiliated with the McGill Faculty of Medicine and Health Sciences.

The Division serves a wide breadth and complexity of patients. The Royal Victoria Hospital is the provincial tertiary referral center for oncologic and reconstructive surgery. The hired candidate will be required to service the general plastic surgery consults and needs of the hospital but will focus on breast and oncologic reconstruction.

McGill University is strongly committed to diversity within its community and welcomes applications from all persons with the appropriate qualifications.

Job Duties

The successful candidate will provide excellent clinical teaching and supervision to undergraduate medical students and residents. They should have a strong interest in research (clinical, basic science, education, or epidemiology). A significant publication record and successful grant funding will be considered as essential assets for this position. The successful candidate will be involved in the academic activities of the McGill Division of Plastic Surgery and be expected to demonstrate aptitude in surgical education.

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McGill faculty members are expected to contribute to service activities within their units, the University, and the wider scholarly community. A demonstrated commitment to equity, diversity, and inclusion is also expected.

Qualifications and Education Requirements

The successful applicant must:

- be licensed or eligible for licensure in Quebec.
- be a Plastic Surgeon board certified by the Royal College of Physicians and Surgeons of Canada and have completed a fellowship in microvascular breast and/or oncologic reconstruction.
- have additional graduate training in the form of an MSc, PhD or a second year of clinical fellowship (required for all surgical hires). Training in the surgical management of lymphedema would be an asset.
- be able to interact effectively in English and in French with patients, families, health care professionals and outside partners, or be prepared to make a serious commitment to attaining this level of language proficiency in the initial period of their appointment.
