Questions

1. Please summarize the project and its key accomplishments to date. In your answer, consider the impact your project has had so far on McGill's campus(es).

This project offered free, fully insured childcare sessions for the School of Architecture. This initiative allowed parents and caregivers to frequent the lecture series. We teamed up with Le Lion et La Souris, a Montreal based education service which provided play sessions during the allotted time. The attending children received recycled materials to build theme-based projects. The projects that the children assembled included knights' swords and shields, model buildings, large city drawings, collaborative art pieces amongst others. Also, we believe that exposing the children to a school of architecture's environment accomplishes sensibilization towards the profession and extends their understanding of how buildings are conceived and made. Without exception, the children that frequented the activities showed interest for the models and drawings displayed around the school and even received old models to play with. One of the main impacts that this project had on McGill's downtown campus is bringing awareness of childcare responsibilities in the lives of many student-parents. Each kid represented one or two parents who had access to a learning activity who otherwise would've missed it. So far, we've had two requests for information about our project: one from the Faculty of Engineering and another from McLennan Library.

The main success of our project was to shed light towards the hidden necessity of childcare for student-parents. Hidden because without access to childcare parents would be required to stay home, deprived from that education opportunity therefore perpetuating the invisibility of the situation. Every child that used our service counts as a key success for the project. Another main accomplishment is having childcare and the Sustainability Project Funds announced before every lecture, directly exposing and sensitizing over 200 participants to the need of childcare for special university events and the importance of McGill's Sustainability Office in supporting like initiatives. The reduced attendance was the main challenge our project faced. We believe that the schedule of the lectures (Tuesdays at 6 pm) was a challenging time for parents to reach the school with their kids regarding dinner, transportation time, etc. Also, the school of Architecture is a small department within the Faculty of Engineering and as such does not have the outreach other larger departments enjoy. The childcare sessions were broadcasted using the school resources such as emails, posters and social networks, nevertheless attendance was low. Local architecture collective Kollektif Montreal announced childcare for the School of Architecture Lecture Series in their board and website. Our project also received praise, recognition and publicity in the prominent website/magazine canadianarchitect.com. In general, the project and the initiative to support student/parents was well received, congratulated and acknowledged as seminal for the advancement of society.

3. What key points of advice or *lessons learned* would you give to other SPF teams either regarding your experience managing your project or the project itself?

The main advice I would pass to future project leaders is to advertise your project relentlessly, not only for the participation but for the exposure it will give to the Sustainability Office and to your subject. This is not only about the results but also about showing the community the students and institutions' efforts for the creation of a more

sustainable world. Also, for projects like ours, I would work on alternatives to further include the departments and the school's direction i.e. formal endorsement via email to all the students or permission to display the project in the most visible place of school. In our case, the room we used for the childcare sessions was far from the main entrance of the school and from the Lectures venue. I believe that having the kids in a more visible area would've been beneficial for the project.

4. What recommendations do you have for the future of this project to be continued and are there any opportunities for complementary projects? Who will take responsibility for the project's future and how can interested persons be in touch? The SPF team will also be in touch with this contact for updates on the project's progress in coming years, if ongoing.

I believe this project should be continued and adapted not only to the needs of the school of architecture but to all McGill's student-parents. One of the main problems, as stated before, was the time of the lectures (complicated for parents and children) but graduate student-parents were looking forward to using it during other events that they must miss due to lack of childcare. More flexible events such as the PhD round table, the graduate forum, and other presentations and lectures aimed toward graduate students are in dire need of an alternative for childcare. Also, I received a number of petitions from fellow student-parents to organize writing-retreats that included childcare, they said that it would greatly benefit they're writing and scholarly work. I propose a bank of available childcare hours per term. This service will be advertised in all major school events such as the Lecture Series and other lectures and if not used it will be offered for writing/study retreats.
