Elective Description

This elective is designed to give Clerkship students exposure to patients with solid tumours. There is a very active patient population which includes breast cancer, gastrointestinal malignancies, sarcomas, testicular tumours, brain tumours, and other tumours. There is an active interest in the pharmacology of the anti-neoplastic agents. We are currently involved in studying innovative combination chemotherapies, new anticancer agents, and new methods of utilizing old chemotherapeutic agents.

Elective Duration

2 to 4 weeks

Scope of Work

There are several different tumour clinics in which the student may participate. There is also a general oncology tumour clinic with a conference every Wednesday morning. In addition, the student can be involved with the in-patient consultation service. There is an emphasis on clinical trials. The student will be able to observe methods and details of this mechanism of clinical care and research.

Elective Description

A clinical elective is available to one Clerkship student at any one time. This elective aims to provide the student with instruction in the broad field of medical oncology ranging from prevention to the management of patients with advanced cancer. A multi-modality approach to cancer will be emphasized. The student will participate in tumour conferences, in-patient consultations, and office follow-ups of patients with various kinds of malignancies, particularly solid tumours. There is excellent opportunity for learning physical examination findings, as well as the basic management of a broad spectrum of medical problems.
