Elective Description

The elective will focus on student participation on a day treatment program for children with severe psychiatric comorbidities.

The student will participate in evaluations and treatment planning.

The student will participate in multimodal interventions, including individual therapy, family therapy and group therapy.

The student will have the opportunity to observe Psychological Testing, Occupational Therapy and Speech/Language Therapy and understand why this relates to Child Psychiatry.

The student will learn and participate in psychopharmacological interventions.

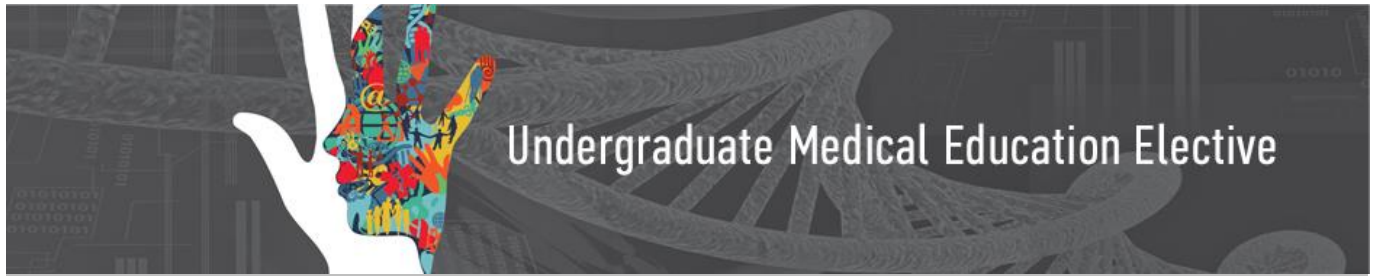
Elective Duration

2, 3, 4 weeks (September to June)

Educational Objectives

By the end of the elective, medical students are expected to have achieved the following objectives:

1. A more in-depth understanding in a specific area of psychiatry.
2. Increased autonomy and ability to conduct a psychiatric evaluation in a specific area.
3. Improved ability to create a biopsychosocial formulation for a psychiatric patient.
4. Improved ability to create a treatment plan for a psychiatric patient.
5. The student will improve interview skills in Psychiatry.
6. The student will improve in writing case reports in Psychiatry.
