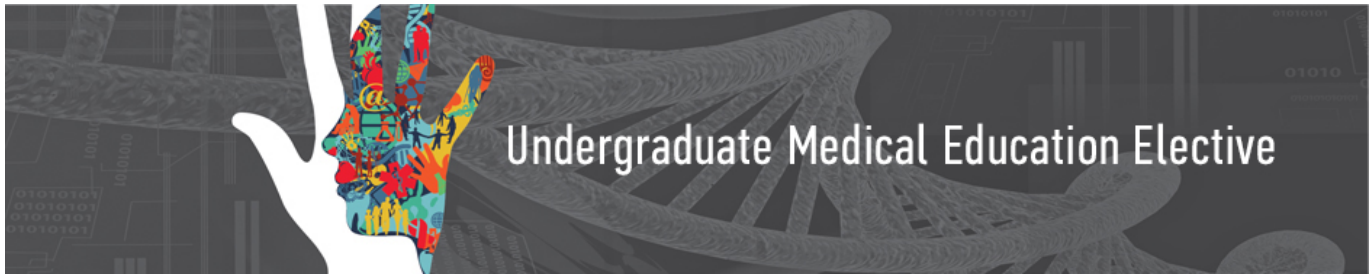

Elective Description			
<p>There are opportunities to participate in ongoing research in social and cultural aspects of Psychiatry. There are three active research teams: the Culture and Mental Health Research Unit based at that the Jewish General Hospital (Dr. L. Kirmayer), Department of Psychiatry; the Culture and Early Psychosis and Language Barriers Projects (Dr. G.E. Jarvis) at the Jewish General Hospital; and the Transcultural Child Psychiatry Program at the CLSC Park Extension (Dr. C. Rousseau). Current research themes include the mental health of First Nations peoples (Inuit and Cree), immigrant and refugee mental health, international mental health, health services, research, and psychiatry in primary care. Students will join an existing project and review the literature in a relevant domain, conduct research diagnostic and/or ethnographic interviews and learn to analyze quantitative and qualitative epidemiological data already collected. There is also an opportunity for students interested in medical writing to participate in the editing of the scientific journal Transcultural Psychiatry, which is based at McGill.</p>
