

David Danto, Ph.D., R. Psych. Brief Bio 2025

Dr. David Danto is Vice-Provost and Dean, Health and Community Studies at MacEwan University, in O-day'min, amiskwaciwâskahikan (Edmonton, Alberta, Canada) on Treaty 6 Territory. An academic leader and administrator, he is a Registered Clinical Psychologist, serves on the Council of the College of Alberta Psychologists, currently as President Elect, and is a Fellow of the Canadian Psychological Association (CPA).

An award-winning instructor and author, Dr. Danto's scholarship focuses on health, community, and human rights, with an emphasis on reconciliation and culturally grounded approaches to addressing intergenerational trauma in both local and global contexts. He is the co-editor of *Indigenous Knowledge and Mental Health: A Global Perspective* (Springer, 2022). He was the founding Chair of the CPA Task Force on Responding to the Truth and Reconciliation Commission Report and chaired the CPA's Standing Committee on Reconciliation.

Clinically, Dr. Danto has practiced in psychiatric hospitals, counselling centres, private practice, and correctional institutions in Canada and the United States. He has delivered keynote addresses and invited presentations for organizations including the American Psychological Association, Canadian Psychological Association, Canadian Council of Professional Psychology Programs, Canadian Armed Forces, and the International Society for Health and Human Rights, as well as numerous universities in Canada, the U.S., and internationally.
